Time Capsule Ornaments

Preserving the Year to Hang on a Tree



A great gift idea for children to bring home for the holidays, these personalized ornaments contain memorable information about the maker. They can be enjoyed as a decoration for the tree and as a walk down memory lane!

To Do and Notice

- 1. Cut the gift wrap or decorative paper into festive shapes and decorate the outside of the container. Optional: add seasonal stickers or other decorations.
- 2. Roll a piece of shiny material and place it into the container.
- 3. Fill the ornament with a variety of items that represent the maker. These items can vary according to the maker's age and interests. The possibilities are endless! Here are a few suggestions:

- 4. Close the ornament container the cap.
- 5. Tie a piece of string or yarn around the ornament. Alternatively, curl a piece of ribbon using scissors or a pencil and tie around the ornament.
- 6. Optional: Make a tag out of colorful cardstock with a message or name. Tie the tag to the ornament with string, yarn, or ribbon.
- 7. Hang the ornament onto a tree using an opened paper clip.

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
