Materials

Materials in the kit may vary but generally, this kit contains the following creative reuse materials:

- Tongue Scrapers
- Bottle caps
- Stamp pads
- Plastic clips

- Wooden circle
- Straws
- CD
- Pipette tips



Facilitation

From trash to treasure this kit can be thought of as a recycled art project. When first developed it was intended as a mural project where students create their own artwork on a cardboard square and then joined their pieces together to form a creative reuse mural. Use it as such or to promote self-expression, shared experiences, communication and/or to explore geometric shapes and patterns.

A few suggestions for getting started:

- Have students explore and name the various materials.
- Give students a prompt: "This (hold up selected item) reminds me of _____.'
- Challenge students to make a shape (square, circle, trapezoid) using a limited number of materials.

Once students have had a chance to explore the material, pick from the design challenge prompts below or create your own. Give students plenty of time and space to plan, create and make.

Design Challenge Prompts

This kit does not come with assembly instructions. Instead, students are to respond to a design challenge prompt using available materials to create their own version. Select one of the following or choose your own.



Creating a Community Message with Murals:

Your school has not come together in person for over a year. Your school has decided to showcase the artistic power of your community by banding together to create a multimedia paneled mural that expresses your feelings of coming back in person as a community.

Challenge Statement:

Create a mural that expresses a message of unity and individuality through your design.

A Geometric Gallery Submission:

A world famous art dealer is looking for the next big thing in mural art. He has put on a contest that asks for artists to make unique geometric and 3D mural designs. The winner of his contest will be awarded a spot in his gallery and eternal fame.

Challenge Statement:

Create a mural that has six unique geometric shapes, five different colors and has four panels.
