RAFT & DISTANCE LEARNING

- Delivered over 120,000 STEAM Project Kits to Title-1 schools to keep students engaged during distance learning.
- 30% of the students RAFT serves are from Title-1 schools that support underserved communities. Title-1 schools are those schools with a high percentage of students receiving free or reduced lunch and are typically underserved and underfunded.
- Developed over 120 FREE STEAM Learning Activity Sheets with over 10,000 downloads to date. These sheets lead families in engaging hands-on lessons that use common household items.
- Developed virtual professional development workshops to help educators incorporate hands-on learning in the digital classroom.
- Membership available to ALL so our affordable resources are accessible to as many people as possible. Effective last year, all parents, educators, administrators, and everyone helping educate in the times of distance learning are eligible for a RAFT membership.

- Virtual RAFT Maker Nights. These events welcomed educators, students and their families to come together in community by participating in engaging, hands-on activities hosted by RAFT staff.
- **Engineering Design Challenges.** To help students stay engaged and creative, RAFT staff created Engineering Design Challenges. These challenges propose a fun challenge, such as Catching a Leprechaun. Students use household items and their creativity to solve the challenge.
- Makerspace builds and Maker
 Mobile visits to schools. As students slowly transition back to the classroom,



RAFT visits schools to host makerspace builds and the RAFT Maker Mobile brings materials to school to host engaging, hands-on activities. After these events, students report enjoying the activities and feel confident about their work.

RAFT helps educators and parents help students develop 21stcentury learning skills. As more students and educators transition back to the in-person classroom, RAFT's hands-on, STEAM resources are what educators and families need to keep their students engaged, learning, and joyful.

STEAM Project Kits and Design Challenges:

Our kits and challenges make learning STEAM principles engaging and fun.

STEAM Learning Activities & Resources:

Free activity sheets, idea sheets, lessons, and teacher tips for Pre-K to 8th grade activities. They are available online and many are available in multiple languages.

Professional Development:

Educators continue to learn best practices for hands-on STEAM learning with our professional development workshops covering a range of topics, skills, and methods.

Makerspace Builds and Maker Mobile Events:

RAFT is proud to partner with schools to help develop and create their own makerspaces to encourage student's curiosity and handson learning. Our Maker Mobile brings the resources and activities to schools for engaging, hands-on learning events.

RAFT STEAM Summer and Afterschool Programs: Our

STEAM Summer Program develops each year and the foundation is being built for our afterschool programs. We are working on creating a "RAFT in a box" model that can be used at various community organizations that seek to accelerate STEAM learning opportunities for their students.

STEAM Project Kits & Design Challenges

STEAM Project Kits Available: 64

RAFT provides STEAM Project Kits that address Science, Technology, Engineering , Arts, and Math (STEAM) concepts while aligning to Common Core and Next Generation Science Standards.

Many of RAFT's kits serve a wide range of grades. Each kit includes required materials, assembly instructions, and suggested activities.

Our kits are affordable and accessible for all educators and students because they are largely made from repurposed materials donated from Bay Area companies.

These kits are also packed by our volunteers to keep the cost of production very low. These quality hands-on learning materials are available for purchase online and in our store.

The past year, RAFT added four new kits that are also available online. Mural, Bread Bag Parachute, Articulated Leg (partnership with 49ers), and Makerspace in a Box. RAFT also created 7 new kits serving over 6,000 students in grades TK through 2nd grade. These kits will become part of our catalogue in 2022.

Student Design Challenges

Created and facilitated by RAFT staff, students engage in these challenges that take advantage of household materials and/or use RAFT supplied materials.

Challenges can be live or asynchronous, students can opt-in and are supported by RAFT office hours to engage students directly and take some of the burden off educators.

RAFT has already served over 1800 students in these challenges since shelter-in-place began.

STEAM LEARNING ACTIVITIES FOR HOME AND CLASSROOM

STEAM Learning Activity Sheets Available Online: 120

RAFT began adjusting our STEAM Learning Activities to specifically serve parents and students learning from home. These sheets serve as free, downloadable, online tools that guide parents, guardians, and Pre-K to 8th grade students through hands-on activities using common household items without the need to purchase additional materials.


Classroom Activities, Lessons, and Tips: RAFT also offers **753 other free downloadable resources** for their use in the physical and virtual classroom including the following:

Classroom STEAM Idea Sheets: These 700 sheets

provide activities and strategies that provide educators with practical methods for effectively presenting engaging STEAM content.

Teacher Tip Sheets: The **33 sheets** provide ideas and strategies for a wide range of classroom facilitation topics including: engagement, classroom management, assessment, incorporating best practices from various content areas, and more.

STEAM Lesson Units: 20 available for grades K-8; these lessons are designed for both classroom and makerspace settings, and some can be adapted to virtual settings.







PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT AND TRAINING

Supported 14,250 students and 780 teachers virtually with hands-on STEAM activities for at-home use in 2020-2021.

RAFT believes in providing the training necessary for educators to continue to develop their skills and be comfortable with hands-on learning techniques and STEAM subjects.

We tailor our professional development support to meet the specific needs of schools and districts. Whether it's in support of a multiple-year district-wide initiative or a small scale pilot, we meet teachers where they are and work in partnership throughout the school year.

RAFT offers in-person, virtual, as well as hybrid workshops. Each workshop takes advantage of our warehouse of bulk materials and extensive catalog of learning activities to explore STEAM topics and design challenges that follow grade-level standards and best practices.

All of our workshops are hands-on and participants leave with ideas and materials for implementation in the classroom. RAFT training hours can often be applied towards continuing education units issued through San Jose State University. RAFT offers workshops for individual members as well as for schools and organizations.



Each workshop takes advantage of our warehouse of bulk materials and extensive catalog of learning activities to explore STEAM topics and design challenges that follow grade-level standards and best practices.

Makerspace Builds and New Maker Mobile Events

Total Makerspace Builds Completed: 54 Total Makerspace Programs Supported: 18

A makerspace is a physical space where students and educators can engage in hands-on learning without having to worry about the dynamics and organization of a typical classroom setting.

Makerspaces come equipped with all the tools and materials necessary to engage in a variety of hands-on learning experiences such as science lab materials, woodworking tools, sewing machines, and so much more.

RAFT supports schools in their makerspace programs in a variety of ways including the following:

- Design Consultation and Implementation Plan
- Community Makerspace Builds
- Makespace Support and Training
- Hands-On Materials and Materials Management

RAFT Maker Mobile

The RAFT Maker Mobile comes equipped with all the tools, materials, and staff support to deliver our unique programming as



a classroom extension. This van helps close the equity gap by serving under-resourced schools by providing high-quality training and learning materials that usually are not available to these schools. RAFT's Maker Mobile will visit Title 1 schools, which typically have a higher percentage of underserved students, for Maker Education lessons, training, and events.

These activities will include design challenges and STEAM instruction while using hands-on

tools, such as laser cutters and woodworking tools, to ensure these students have access to quality hands-on education.

RAFT received a generous grant from the Sharks Foundation and Western Digital to create the RAFT Maker Mobile.







RAFT STEAM SUMMER AND AFTERSCHOOL PROGRAMS

Before and during the COVID-19 pandemic, RAFT has developed and provided in-person and virtual Summer Camp programs. In July 2020, RAFT shifted our summer school to a virtual summer camp to adhere to social distancing.



RAFT recruited students from ages 6-13 to attend our weeklong, virtual summer camps. RAFT instructors conducted lessons and worked with students as they developed a STEAM Project to present at the end of each week-long session. RAFT staff shipped materials to each participant in advance to ensure students had access to hands-on materials for this virtual program. This program provided 720 instructional minutes to aid students in retention of STEAM subjects over the summer. This program also helped RAFT create professional development sessions on how educators can provide hands-on learning experiences during distance learning.

RAFT is currently developing our in-person and online Summer and Afterschool program for 2022, with the goal to replicate this program in schools and locations across the Bay Area, California, and the US.

RAFT IN THE COMMUNITY

Partnerships

RAFT partners with schools, school districts, county offices of education and nonprofits to support educators and students. RAFT helps build teacher comfort, capacity and confidence in implementing hands-on, student-led learning through workshops, ongoing professional development, curricular resources and events with these partners. We help schools create and run pilot programs exploring hands-on STEAM integration in anticipation of school-wide implementation.

Community Events and Field Trips

We support community events such as STEAM showcases, family STEAM nights, and Generations Day. At these events, RAFT provides STEAM Project Kits, design challenge materials, and support staff to engage participants in hands-on STEAM activities.

RAFT has also hosted virtual events to engage families in hands-on-learning while also building a sense of community as students and families find ways to connect with each other.

RAFT also offers field trips. RAFT's school field trips help develop skills and knowledge in multiple content areas and grade bands. Interactive tours teach students to learn to identify materials based on their attributes and engage in hands-on activities and design challenges aligned to standards that explore real-world phenomena.





RAFT STORE

Retail: 32,000 square foot facility

Located in San Jose, the RAFT Store is a memberbased shopping and resource environment where educators of all varieties come to shop, collaborate, and learn. We have been called the "Costco" and "Home Depot" of educator supplies, where our low-cost and unique offerings help our members stretch their dollar and maximize the impact for their students. RAFT also offered two major parking lot sales to increase our membership and offer a socially distanced shopping option.

Online Shopping: RAFT has expanded our online shopping options to include our new and repurposed materials in addition to our STEAM Project Kits. Members have delivery and curbside pick-up options as well.

Parents as Members: With the enhanced learning being more important than ever, Parents are now welcome to become members and to shop at RAFT! Our pre-built STEAM kits - popular for years with educators and children especially during distance learning - makes it easy for parents to enhance their children's hand-on learning experiences at home.

Renovations: RAFT continues our renovation plan started in 2019 by adding store directional signage, adding a new audio system and video wall to showcase our events and programs. By early 2022 we will have remodeled restrooms and thanks to a generous donation from one of our Corporate partners, RAFT will be 100% solar powered, furthering our "green" mission. **Resources:** RAFT members have access to a wide variety of educator resources needed for planning classroom lessons and activities. With the largest collection of die cuts in the Bay Area and many teacher workrooms at schools closing down, RAFT is the place for every educator to prepare their classrooms and support their students.

- Educator Workroom: Our Educator Workroom is a creative workspace equipped with a variety of materials and tools to meet educators' needs. RAFT staff provides assistance, and our members have the opportunity to collaborate and learn from other RAFT members.
- Educator Lab: RAFT's Educator Lab is an innovative space with a variety of resources and equipment for developing unique designs and creating new teaching tools. Educator Lab events include skills-based workshops, STEAM showcases and community events, and guest speakers series. We plan to upgrade our Educator Lab in 2022.



This helps build into the learning process for kids the importance of our natural resources and their role in being stewards of the environment.
